The course is now being offered to livestock producers to better equip them for addressing livestock predation issues. The course will take 2 days and we must have 12 participants register to run the course. Dawson Creek has been selected as one of the BC locations. The instructor will be Carl Gitscheff.

The majority of the course cost is covered however there will be a \$50.00 registration fee, payable in 2- \$25.00 cheques, and so long as the participants show up for both days, one cheque will be returned to participant.

The course will primarily focus on teaching the various skill sets necessary for trapping wild canine (wolf and coyote) there will be a big % of the course emphasis on hands on work so much of it will be outside and participants should have appropriate clothing for the weather of the day.
